Active Drug Ingredient:

Lasalocid

Caution:

The safety of Lasalocid in unapproved species has not been established. Do not allow horses or other equine access to Lasalocid as ingestion may be fatal. Feed at a rate of not less than 60 mg nor more than 200 mg per head per day. This feed contains 25mg of Lasalocid per pound of feed.

Feeding Directions:

This is a highly palatable, 12% protein, textured feed, designed to be fed as a creep feed to calves that are still nursing. Feed at the rate of 3 to 10 pounds per head per day for increased weight gain (normally 40-80 pounds of weight gain over non creep fed calves), and decreased stress at weaning. Creep feeds are

designed to provide supplemental energy and protein above that which is provided by the animal's mother. This helps the young animal sustain an increased rate of growth and should be seriously considered any time that the cost of gain is less than the calves average value per pound. Example: A calf should convert 5 pounds of feed to one pound of gain. If 5 pounds of feed cost 50 cents, then 1 pound of gain will cost you 50 cents. If calves are bringing more than 50 cents per pound, then it pays for a producer to creep feed his calves. Creep feeding calves also reduces the stress on the brood cow nursing the calf. This will lead to better body condition and faster breed back times for cows. This feed also supplies supplemental minerals and vitamins along with Lasalocid (Bovatec). Bovatec has been shown to increase growth, feed efficiency, and reduce the incidence of coccidiosis in cattle. Do not feed this product free choice to weaned calves or mature cattle. Do not feed to horses. Do not allow sheep access to this feed.

Important Management Practices:

Provide a source of clean water at all times. Always provide free choice minerals and vitamins. When introducing creep feed to calves expect a transition period before calves will readily consume feed. Consider feeding calves with cows for several days before allowing calves to have sole access to creep feeder. Do not allow feed to become wet or moldy, because this could lead to digestive upsets. Poorly managed feeding programs can also increase the possibility of digestive problems.
